

LAWGID Program Partnership Agreement

Excerpt from the Annex 4: Mobility Scheme for Students and Teachers

- LAWGID students' mobility track is determined by the proposed LAWGID Curriculum, according to which LAWGID students complete the first semester at the University of Belgrade – Faculty of Law, the second semester at Libera Università Maria SS. Assunta di Roma, Department of Law, Economics and Communication, Palermo, and the third one at Örebro University, Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. Compulsory physical mobility for all enrolled students has been determined and cannot be replaced by e-learning.
- LAWGID student expresses wishes in regards to the partner university at which they want to do the necessary scientific research, submission and defense of the Master Thesis.
- LAWGID students' wishes are carefully taken into consideration, but the LAWGID Consortium Management Board (LCMB) also takes into consideration that the number of Master Theses to be defended at each partner university is well balanced. Guidelines for the LCMB in considering LAWGID students' wishes and making final decisions are linked to the strategic idea that approximately one third of the total number of Master Theses shall be conducted at each of the partner universities.
- The mobility of LAWGID students with disabilities will be cautiously planned in terms of providing support for assistance by a third person, adaptation of the work environment at all partner universities if necessary (for example, if the lift for the disabled persons or lecturers is missing to find the solution for the needed transport, or if audio-visual aids for disabled individuals are needed to provide them, etc.), and providing additional travel/transportation costs.
- The mobility of invited guest lecturers with disabilities will be particularly planned, due to individual needs.
- Mobility of the scholars from partner universities as well as the contribution of invited guest lecturers will represent a crucial dimension of conducting the LAWGID program structure.
- The LAWGID academic staff from partner universities will take part in holding lectures not only at their home universities but will also travel to the partner universities for the sake of holding lectures on site, together with the LAWGID team members from those partner universities. Staff mobility is relevant and contributes to advancing and internationalizing teaching, learning, training, and academic research activities.
- The LCMB will make plans to invite in each semester up to 5 invited guest lecturers from other prestigious European and world university centres, competent within particular dimensions of feminist perspectives in law and social sciences and humanities, and who will offer an added value in holding particular lectures within the LAWGID program.



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
